This position is open to School of Public Health PhD, MPH, and MS students.

#### **Position Description:**

The Best Starts for Kids (BSK) Adolescent Health and Immunization Improvement Program (AHIIP) aims to increase health care provider endorsement of recommended adolescent vaccines, reduce obstacles to vaccination access and improve adolescent vaccination coverage in King County. To support these goals, AHIIP is providing the leadership and expertise to build and facilitate evidence-based quality improvement processes in an Improvement Partnership with Public Health – Seattle & King County, health care and school-based provider organizations and community-based partners. The Department of Epidemiology is looking to hire a Research Assistant to work on this project.

# **Duties and Responsibilities:**

The RA will support the project team through the following activities:

- conduct a landscape assessment of national Improvement Partnerships activities focused on improving immunization coverage, including key objectives, measures, tools, resources and findings;
- create an inventory of quality improvement activities (trainings, activities, materials, etc.) that aim to change healthcare practice around adolescent vaccination and improve immunization coverage that includes extraction of key indicators, data sources, implementation methods, and outcomes for each activity;
- assist in developing project charter agreements with participating health care providers and organizations;
- serve as liaison between project stakeholders;
- organize and schedule regular project meetings, including development of agenda;
- assist the project communications team in development of marketing and recruitment materials: and
- maintain detailed project management and methods documentation.

The RA will also be expected to attend weekly team meetings, work with project partners across King County, assist in preparation of reports, and support other project activities as needed.
