- Students may register for elective courses and EPI 600 Independent Study in order to have enough total credits.
- Students intending to complete a PhD in this department are advised to take the Doctoral Preliminary Examination in June after their first year.
- To request a waiver or substitution of a required course, use the Waiver/Substitution form found on the [Epi Students](#) Canvas site. Be sure to review the Waiver/Substitution Policy (also found in Epi Students) to be sure the course you plan to waive/substitute is eligible for waiver or substitution - follow the instructions for course waivers/substitutions found on the Epi Students Canvas site to request approval.

¹**These courses/credits do not count toward a degree in Epidemiology:** Any courses below the 500 level, EPI 500, EPI 511, HUBIO 530, BIST 502-503, BIST 508, BIST 517-18 *when taken in addition to* BIST 511-13, BIST 511-13 *when taken in addition to* BIST 517-18, courses taken to complete a degree program at another department/university, credits in courses for which waivers were granted, non-health related courses.

- *Students, with approval from their faculty advisor and the Graduate Program Director, may count non-health related, graduate level coursework taken at the UW toward their degree, if it is particularly relevant to their research/career.*
